Researchers believe that brain changes in adolescents increase the chance for teens to get depression and anxiety. According to a national database, anxiety disorders are the most common mental health disorders of adolescence. Nearly one in three adolescents (31.9%) will meet the criteria for an anxiety disorder by the age of 18. Depression and bipolar disorder affect 14.3% of teens aged 13-17. Today, high school students have more anxiety symptoms and are twice as likely to see a mental health professional than teens in the 1980s. According to statistics, girls are more than twice as likely to experience depression than boys, 15.9% vs 7.7%, but this does not mean that there are rarely boys with depression. It is believed that females are more open about depression and anxiety than boys. I personally know many people who suffer from depression and anxiety, both male and female, that are not diagnosed or medicated. 
